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You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand

What is this product?

Type The Company is a closed-ended investment company incorporated in England and Wales and whose Ordinary shares and C shares are admitted to the premium segment and standard segment of the Official List of the UK Listing Authority respectively and whose shares are admitted to trading on the London Stock Exchange plc's main market for listed securities. Typically, at any given time on any given day, the price at which an Ordinary and C share can be bought will be higher than the price at which a Ordinary and C share can be sold.
The C Shares have the right to participate in a fixed, cumulative preferential dividend payable out of the C Share Pool of 3 per cent per annum (based on a C Share price of 100 pence), pro-rated up to the Calculation Date. The C Shares do not carry a right to participate in dividends declared by the Company out of the Ordinary Share Pool or income in excess of the fixed dividend out of the C Share Pool.

Objectives The Company's investment objective is to provide Shareholders with an attractive level of income, together with the potential for capital growth from investing directly in a portfolio of Social Homes, which the Company expects will benefit from inflation adjusted long-term leases or occupancy agreements with Registered Providers and to deliver, on a fully invested and geared basis, a targeted dividend yield of 5 per cent per annum (based on an Ordinary Share price of 100 pence), which the Company expects to increase broadly in line with inflation.

Intended retail investor This product is intended for investors who understand the potential risk of capital loss of investment in shares which are publicly traded, that there may be limited liquidity in the underlying investments of the Company, for whom an investment in the shares is part of a diversified investment programme and who fully understand and are willing to assume the risks involved in such an investment.

Maturity date The C Shares are expected to convert into Ordinary Shares on the basis and timing indicated below. The conversion of the C Shares into Ordinary Shares will be triggered following the earlier of (i) 90 per cent of the C Share Net Issue Proceeds being invested or committed; or (ii) the date 12 months past the date of admission of the C Shares to listing which was 14 November 2017. The C Shares will convert into new Ordinary Shares by dividing the Net Asset Value per C Share by the Net Asset Value per Ordinary Share.
